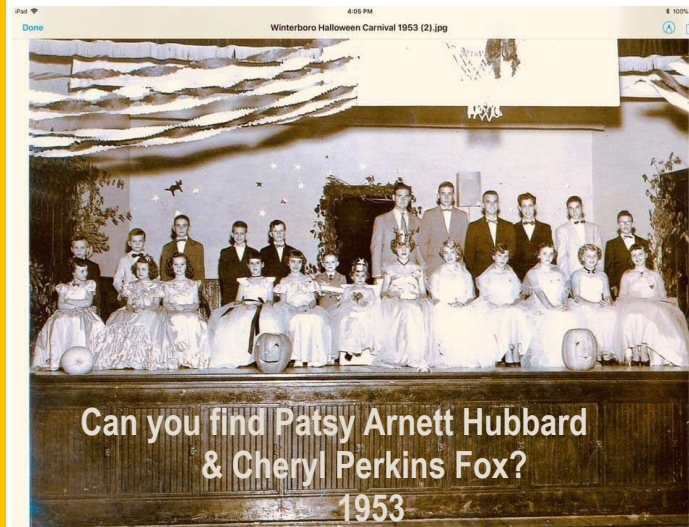
# The Alpine Gossip
