Over the next several weeks, this covenant will be revised and renewed. Then on January 9th, we, as Alpine Baptist Church, will have an opportunity to recommit to our church covenant.

I hope this work of recognizing and recommitting will be a service of renewal for you. Whether you are a long-time member that has been committed to this church for decades or a new member that's just getting started, I hope you will be renewed. If you are reading this and haven't darkened the doorstep of the church in years or your church attendance has been sporadic at best, I hope you will come and be renewed. If you are tired, unsure about church, searching for meaning or purpose, looking for a Christ-centered and loving community, or needing some folks to pray with you, I hope you will come and be renewed.
