


Two more weeks of wearing a mask in the church building. Then we will reassess. Good news is the count is going down.

From The Front Porch

This month marks one year since my first visit to Alpine Baptist Church. It's been one year since I spotted our beautiful church building, looked up at the chandeliers in the sanctuary, learned about the history of our church from pictures on the walls, shared coffee in the fellowship hall with many of you, and, most importantly met you. It's been one year since I first worshipped with you, prayed with you, fellowshipped with you, and heard your stories about how God had worked in your life through our church. It's been one year since I walked out of the sanctuary grateful for Alpine Baptist Church.

Many Sundays have passed since that first visit. After each Sunday, I have walked out of the sanctuary grateful for Alpine Baptist Church. I'll admit, some Sundays this has been more difficult than others (I'm thinking of the Sundays that have been impacted by COVID-19) and some Sundays easier than others (I'm thinking of baptism or dedication Sundays because I find these events particularly meaningful), but I have been intentional to walk out of the sanctuary grateful for Alpine Baptist Church.

This discipline is informed by some of the pastoral voices in my life. Paul says in Colossians 1:3, "We always thank God, the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, when we pray for you...". Dietrich Bonhoeffer writes, "Because God has already laid the only foundation for our fellowship, because God has bound us together in one body with other Christians in Jesus Christ, long before we entered into that common life with them, we enter that common life...as thankful recipeints." Bonhoeffer continues, "If we do not give thanks daily for the Christian fellowship in which we have been placed, even where there is not great experience, no discoverable riches, but much weakness, small faith and difficulty; then we hinder God from letting our fellowship grow according to the measure and riches which are there for us all in Jesus Christ."

One year removed from my first words of gratitude about Alpine Baptist Church, I hope these voices will continue to guide me in practicing gratitude for the gift of God's church; the gift of each of you gathered together in the name of Jesus Christ. I hope you will join us for worship this coming Sunday. After worship we'll walk out of the sanctuary grateful for what God is doing and grateful for Alpine Baptist Church.
