All of these are signs of new years resolutions. Some of the most common new years resolutions every year are to lose weight, eat healthier, get organized, pick up a new hobby, and spend less money. These are all good, commendable things for a person to work towards.

Typically, the resolve people have to accomplish these things at the beginning of the year begins to wane well before the end of winter.
