# \*\*\*From The Front Porch\*\*\*

Unexpected conversations are par for the course when it comes to high school reunions. In the course of reconnecting with people at my ten year reunion, I met another pastor, Ted. Ted is married to a former high school classmate. They'd moved to a city in Louisiana to plant a church. As happens with pastors, Ted and I started talking about church. Not too far into our conversation, Ted asked me how many people attend Alpine Baptist. I told him we had between thirty to forty-five attend worship. He responded, "Well I know you aren't satisfied with that! What's your growth strategy?"

I was, to be honest, somewhat taken aback by his response. With a comment of such presumptive boldness, part of me wanted to look at Hannah, and pointing to Ted, say, "Who does this guy think he his?" Part of me wanted to say, "You know Ted, Jesus Christ said, 'Where two or three are gathered in my name, there I am." Instead, I dodged the question. I didn't want to get into an ecclesiological debate in a brewery at my high school reunion with someone I'd just met.

I also understood where Ted's question was coming from. There were times when I'd thought about the church along the same lines. Ted's response originates with a view of the church that says the bigger a church is (bigger buildings, bigger staff, bigger programming, etc.) the more life or vitality within said church. In this understanding, the life of a church depends on getting resources, not the revelation of the Living Christ among us through the power of the Holy Spirit and the indwelling love of God in the present body of Christ, the church.

This Fall, at Alpine Baptist, we are going to begin having a church-wide conversation that, I hope, will be important in the life of our church. We are going to begin a process of discernment. Discernment comes from the two Latin words that mean to sift through. We'll have the opportunity to sift through our past and present in order to get a better sense of how God is working among us and God's call upon us as Alpine Baptist. There will be a lot more information about what this process of discernment will look like in the coming weeks...this is already a lengthy column.

I've told the story about Ted as a cautionary tale because we're all tempted to hold to Ted's view of the church. As we begin this process of discernment, it's my prayer that we will do so seeking to know God's will, bear witness to the living Christ, and encounter the power of the Spirit through listening, reflecting, and engaging in the story of our church. Will you join me in this prayer?
