David and his wife Marguerite fled the Ivory Coast ten years ago. After landing in Togo they gained official refugee status and began the long wait for resettlement. When they visited Togo House to inquire about its activities, we learned that they lived on the next street and had already begun prayer meetings and Bible studies in their home. They became faithful supporters of our Sunday Mornings at Togo House, offering prayer, counsel and bringing others. One of David's greatest contributions was his encouragement to the children and teenagers who helped lead worship.

He gave positive instruction on how to speak up and be heard, how to address the group. Some who had been too timid to participate gained confidence to lead the group in learning a Bible verse or song.

When our boys wished to learn to play **petanque** David, who had played on his country's team, coached them to become skilled players. While they patiently awaited resettlement, he and his wife were never idle.

Last year, Marguerite passed away suddenly. It was a blow, but David never lost his faith or sense of purpose. He walked the neighborhood, discovered needs, and looked for ways to help. Last month, it was finally his turn to go to America. In his last days here, neighbors and Togo House kids gathered to say goodbye to Monsieur David and to wish him well.

The effects of his steady faithfulness and care will linger long after his departure. Pray for good adjustment, continued service and meaningful relationships in his new home in the U.S.
