# \*\*\*From The Front Porch\*\*\*

I joined a mountain biking group ride this past Saturday in Sylacauga. When other folks found out I pastored Alpine Baptist Church, they commented on the beauty of our church building. One person said, "I didn't know Baptists had church buildings like that...I thought it was only the Presbyterians and Methodists." In response to such comments, I say something like, "Yes, it is a great building! The folks at the church have done a great job of maintaining it over the years." I suppose there are many reasons you and others before you have maintained our church building. I suspect a sense of gratitude is one reason.

Pastor and Reformer Martin Luther said that gratitude is the "basic Christian attitude." For Luther, this attitude of gratitude doesn't arise from counting your blessings, but from being encountered by the grace of God. The grace of God transforms a person and leaves them with the God-given desire to be, in Luther's words, "ready and glad, without compulsion, to do good to everyone, to serve everyone, to suffer everything, in love and praise of God, who has shown him this grace." In a word, the Christian life is one of gratitude in response to God's grace.

Here's where I'm going with this. We are in the final quarter of 2022. The end of the year is important for the financial health of our church. All of us need to do our best to give faithfully to Alpine Baptist over the next several weeks to ensure that we meet our budget needs for the year. If you've given faithfully throughout the year, I ask that you try to give a little more in the coming weeks.

At the end of each school term, Cheikh comes into our office and thanks us. Without fail, he is smiling and shaking our hands, or fist bumping since COVID. Cheikh is a refugee from West Africa. Thankfully, Uganda continues to provide a refuge for over 1,000,000 refugees like Cheikh and his family. Cheikh has two young sons who attend primary school in Kampala. Our ministry provides school fees for about 12 students and two of these scholarships are for his sons. While Cheikh is not a Christian, he constantly says, "God bless you! God bless your family! God bless this place."

Without these scholarships, there is no way his children could attend school. He proudly shows us their report cards at the end of each term. And at the beginning of each term, when school fees are due, he comes into our offices and says loudly for everyone to hear. "THANK YOU!!" He leaves with a smile on his face, but goes into uncertainty. He has had several jobs, but finding and keeping a job is hard in Kampala. Their family struggles and have struggled for many years. He hopes one day to return home. But for now, he scrapes by to provide for his family. Thankfully, his two boys are in a good school and are making good grades. God has provided for them, and we are all thankful.
